# Chapter 01

Formative Years 2000-2002



#### **Formative Years**


It was the dawn of the new millennium. The previous half century had witnessed a marked decline in maternal mortality in Sri Lanka as a result of better obstetric care, well-woman clinics, and maternal mortality reviews. However, health care of women after the reproductive period was found wanting. Menopause was less talked about by the public as well as the medical professionals. It occupied a less significant area in the curricula of medical undergraduates and postgraduates and other paramedical fields.

Against this backdrop, Dr. M.D.P. Gooneratne, a consultant obstetrician and gynaecologist at De Soyza Maternity Hospital, and at the time a council member and the treasurer of the Sri Lanka College of Obstetricians & Gynaecologists (SLCOG), proposed the establishment of a professional body exclusively focused on menopause-related matters at a council meeting of SLCOG in early 2000.

Although some members voiced concerns that a portion of gynecological medical practice might be taken over by the new society, the then-president of SLCOG, Dr. Rohan Perera, supported the proposal. Most objections were eventually withdrawn, and the formation of the new society proceeded with the blessings of SLCOG. Acting as the convener, Dr. Gooneratne subsequently placed an advertisement in the newspapers to initiate the process.

An inaugural meeting was soon organized, bringing together a group of like-minded clinicians who recognised the growing need for a dedicated platform to address menopausal health. This gathering marked the first formal step toward the establishment of a specialised society that would advocate for education, research, and clinical excellence in the field of menopause care.

The inaugural meeting was held on 19 June 2000 at 8 pm in the library of Castle Street Hospital for Women (CSHW), Colombo.

#### First Ordinary General Meeting

The first Ordinary General Meeting of the new society was held on 5th July 2000 at the same venue, with 19 members in attendance.

During the meeting, the name of the society was discussed. While the majority favored naming it the **Post Reproductive Health and Menopause Society**, concerns were raised that the name might make it difficult to attract members. Dr. M.D.P. Gooneratne suggested the name **Menopause Society** to ensure better international recognition. It was ultimately agreed to retain the name **Post Reproductive Health and Menopause Society** for the time being.

The draft of the constitution of the Post Reproductive Health and menopause society was approved with minor amendments.

The **first council meeting** of the Post Reproductive Health and Menopause Society of Sri Lanka was held on **23 July 2000 at 6:00 PM in the library of Castle Street Hospital for Women, Colombo 8**. The meeting began with the lighting of the traditional oil lamp. It was decided to invite medical students to create a logo for the society.

The format for the membership application form was agreed upon, with an enrollment fee of Rs. 100 and an annual subscription fee of Rs. 500. The following subcommittees were appointed:



#### Name of the Society

A Special General Meeting was held on 10 September 2000 to reach a final decision on the name of the society. Dr. Gooneratne, the President, explained that the term "Menopause Society" was significant for establishing connections with international organizations, and emphasised that interest in joining the society was growing regardless of the final name. As a result, the President's proposal to adopt the name "Menopause Society of Sri Lanka" (MENOSOC) was unanimously approved by the membership.

#### Logo and Banner

It was decided to hold a competition among medical students from the faculties to design a suitable logo, with a prize offered for the best entry. Although the response was limited, a few samples were received from two council members. The logo drawn by Dr. Janaka Weeratunga was presented by Dr. J.N. Rodrigo and was selected. A banner was made, which originally featured only English and Sinhala text; it was later decided to include Tamil lettering as well.



#### **International Meetings**

The President represented the Menopause Society of Sri Lanka at the 5 Australasian Menopause Society Congress held in Melbourne from 25 to 27 October 2001.

### 30 June 2002 - Inaugural Scientific Sessions & First Annual General Meeting

At the council meeting held on 20 January 2002, it was decided to hold the scientific session and the Annual General Meeting (AGM) on Sunday, **30 June 2002**. The President contacted Prof. Peter Rogers of Monash University, Melbourne, Australia, whom he had met at the 5th Australasian Menopause Society Congress. Prof. Rogers, a research scientist specializing in angiogenesis, agreed to attend the sessions. Additionally, Prof. Harsha Seneviratne agreed to contact Dr. Duru Shah of Mumbai, India. Meanwhile, the President reached out to Dr. Shan Viswalingam, who also attended the Melbourne session and agreed to participate along with his colleague Dr. Hugh Torode from Sydney.





Prof. Wilfred Perera booked the auditorium of the SLMA, and several names were suggested for the Chief Guest. Ultimately, Mrs. Amara Piyaseeli Ratnayake, Minister of Women's Affairs, was invited as the Chief Guest, with Prof. Peter Rogers serving as the Guest of Honor.

Wyeth Ayerst International Inc. was the main sponsor, while other sponsors included Hemas Pharmaceuticals, Swiss Biogenics, New Zealand Milk Foods, and Mansell Lanka Ltd. Chairs and tables were hired, and sheds were set up for lunch and tea. Tea was provided by CIC, and lunch was catered by Lanka Medicals Ltd. The registration fee was Rs. 250, payable at the SLCOG House or at the registration desk managed by the SLCOG office staff, Ms.

Harshani Morawaka and Ms. Haleema Hameed. Posters were displayed at all major hospitals, medical faculties, and at SLMA.

Registration began at 8:30 AM, followed by the opening ceremony, which started with the lighting of the traditional oil lamp and the singing of the national anthem. The President delivered the welcome speech, followed by a speech from Prof. Peter Rogers, the Guest of Honor. The Chief Guest, Mrs. Amara Piyaseeli Ratnayake, Minister of Women's Affairs then addressed the audience, and the Secretary concluded the ceremony with a vote of thanks.



































The academic session followed the morning tea and began with a guest lecture by Prof. Duru Shah on the new science of Hormone Replacement Therapy (HRT). Prof. Peter Rogers spoke on breakthrough bleeding with HRT, while Prof. Harsha Seneviratne discussed lipids and HRT. Dr. Shan Viswalingam addressed sorting out problems related to HRT, and Dr. Hugh Torode spoke on hormones and breast cancer.

Two free papers were presented during the pre-lunch session. In the post-lunch session, Prof. Duru Shah talked about phytoestrogens, and Dr. Kolitha Sellahewa presented on postmenopausal osteoporosis. Prof. Peter Rogers then introduced the Jean Hailes Menopause Foundation. The program concluded with a symposium on the management of menopause in developing countries, moderated by Dr. Hemantha Perera.

The AGM was held at the Lionel Memorial auditorium of the SLMA.

A well-attended banquet was held at Hotel Taj. The banquet was free for members, with a charge of Rs. 500 for spouses and Rs. 750 for guests.

#### **Educational Activities**

On 18 October 2000, World Menopause Day, the society organized a media conference at the Lionel Memorial auditorium of the Sri Lanka Medical Association (SLMA).

The earliest public educational activity of the newly formed society was when the President delivered a lecture on midlife health problems at "Diyawara Vanitha Ulela" "දියවර වනිතා උළෙල" held at BMICH on December 2nd, 2000, organized by "යයින" news paper. Following this meeting, many letters inquiring about the society and treatment for midlife health problems were received.


The earliest scientific educational activity was its invitation to participate in a satellite symposium during the 3rd SAFOG Conference. This event was organized by the Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology, University of Colombo, in collaboration with Frauenklinik Aschaffenburg, Germany, and the SLCOG. Held on 1st March 2001, the symposium focused on "Practical Issues in Menopause Management."

The Menopause Society was invited by the Lanka Dharmodaya Foundation, an NGO at Dankotuwa, to deliver a talk on menopause and conduct a clinic on 15th February 2001. Dr. M.D.P. Gooneratne and Dr. Rohan Perera were the resource persons. Over 100 women attended the event, and a clinic was held for a number of women presenting with midlife and menopausal health problems. However, a lack of facilities for conducting such clinics was experienced.

The President attended the 5th Australasian Menopause Society Congress, held from 25th to 27th October 2001 in Melbourne, Victoria.

The President was also invited to deliver a talk on menopause on 22nd March 2001 at a meeting on Midlife Health at Kethumathi Maternity Hospital auditorium.

The Menopause Society held a well-attended public awareness meeting on Sunday,1st July 2001, at the Public Library Auditorium organized by Dr Hemantha Perera. Letters were sent to principals of girls' schools, banners were displayed, and posters exhibited at prominent places. The young audience showed great interest in this new topic and asked many questions. Over 300 people attended this event, which helped establish recognition for the society among the general public.



A meeting was held for healthcare workers on 24th March 2002 at the Kandy General Hospital auditorium, followed by a public meeting on 25th March 2002, both organized by Prof. Indrajee Amarasinghe with the Lions Club Kandy.

An awareness program and workshop on the management of menopause and hormone replacement therapy was held on 19th July 2002 at Madara Hotel, Horana, for members of the Kalutara Clinical Society. The Menopause Society conducted a symposium as part of the SLCOG Annual Sessions in 2001, marking one of its early contributions to professional education in the field.

#### Office

The Menopause Society office was located in the same large room occupied by the SLCOG. The office secretary was Ms. Harshani Morawaka, who also served as the SLCOG office secretary.

A bank account was opened at Seylan Bank in August, 2001.

#### Guideline development

In October 2002, an **expert committee** comprising seven members was appointed to review the scientific evidence on the risks and benefits of Hormone Replacement Therapy (HRT), following the publication of the Women's Health Initiative (WHI) report. The committee presented its **summary statement on HRT** use at the council meeting held later that month.

Due to the confusion surrounding HRT use after the WHI report, a workshop addressing the controversies of HRT was held for medical practitioners at BMICH on 24th November 2002.

#### Summary statement on HRT use

Expert Committee of the Menopausal Society of Sri Lanka October 2002

Conflicting scientific evidence at present on benefits and risks of HRT has made it extremely difficult for clinicians to decide on initiation and continuation of HRT for postmenopausal women. This is an attempt to summarize the present knowledge on HRT for the benefit of prescribers.

#### Breast cancer

There are many risk factors for breast cancer, HRT is one of them. Other risk factors include obesity, early menarche, late menopause, age, smoking and alcohol consumption. Epidemiological studies suggest that the risks do not become significant until after 5 years of HRT use.

Among women with current or recent (within past the past 4 years) HRT use, those taking estrogen alone had a 12 fold (95% CL, 1.0 - 1.4) increase in risk of breast cancer, while those taking estrogen plus a progestin in a sequential regimen had a 14 fold increase in risk (95% CL, 11.-1.8). A statistically significant increased risk of breast cancer was observed only in recent users with a lean body weight—those who had a body mass index of less than 24.4 - ACOG Comminue opinion - Risk of Breast Cancer with Estrogen - Progestin Replacement Therapy.

The excess risk, if any, of breast cancer in women using HRT is low. Based on the data from one study (JAMA 2000; 283:485-491), the projected absolute lifetime risk for anon-oestrogen users is about 10 cases of breast cancer per 100 women and would increase from 10 cases to 14 cases per 100 women. The differences between these projected estimates are small, so that true implications of oestrogen and progestin use may not be known. The epidemiologic studies suggest that the increased risks do not become significant until after 5 years of HRT use and disappear 5 years after discontinuation of hormone treatment.

When considering the use of HRT for longer than 5 years, the clinician and individual patient should weigh the benefits versus the potential side effects and risks for that particular patient.










#### **Highlights**

Several important milestones were achieved during this year. The **draft of the Constitution** was officially approved, laying the foundation for the Society's governance and objectives.


# **Highlights**




The **first Awareness Program for Medical Professionals** was conducted in Kandy.




The Annual General Meeting was postponed from 16 November 2003 to 14 March 2004.


Reaching a community with a message needs existing modes as well as new thinking. This depicts the traditional as well as more modern approaches employed by MENOSOC to reach their objectives

# Intended audiences




Over the years, MENOSOC has reached out to many audiences. However, this shows the urgent need to increase the reach to smaller groups if our objectives are to be met.

# **All Awareness Programs**





# Geographical reach





# Organizing teams










Spectrum of the targeted audience appears quite broad. This information provides direction to future expansion plans.





# **Provinces Geographical reach**





At present, only medical organizers appear to be involved. Efforts should be made to reach out to a wider range of institutions in need.





## **Intended Audience**




Most webinars have been conducted for doctors, with some targeting Family Health Workers (Midwives). In the future, this mode of knowledge dissemination will be extended to the general public.

# Languages






Organizing the webinars required dedicated teams, and this aspect calls for involvement beyond just the health professionals engaged so far.



# Chapter 04

**Guideline Development by MENOSOC** 



#### October 2002

An **expert committee** of seven members was appointed to review scientific evidence on the risks and benefits of Hormone Replacement Therapy (HRT) following the publication of the Women's Health Initiative (WHI) report.

The committee presented its "Summary statement on HRT use" at the council meeting held later that month.

#### 13 October 2002

MENOSOC distributed the summary statement on HRT to doctors at BMICH.

### 27 February 2005

A proposal was made at the council meeting to develop "Guidelines for the Management of the Post-Reproductive Years of Women."

#### February 2006

MENOSOC compiled the subdivision related to menopause for the SLCOG National Guidelines.

#### **April 2010**

The "Position Statement of the Menopause Society of Sri Lanka on Estrogen and Progestogen Use in Peri- and Post-Menopausal Women and Some Other Management Options", authored by Dr. M.D.P. Gooneratne and Dr. Hemantha Perera was published in the *Sri Lanka Journal of Obstetrics and Gynaecology* 31(2).

#### September 2019

In the first volume of the *Sri Lanka Journal of Menopause*, an article titled "Menopausal Hormone Therapy with Estrogen and Progestogen", authored by Dr. Hemantha Perera and Dr. Chanil Ekanayaka was published.

# 25 July 2021

During a council meeting, it was noted that no exclusive guidelines on menopause management existed in Sri Lanka.

The council decided to prepare new National guidelines, identifying key topic areas (vasomotor symptoms; vulvar atrophy; sexual health; quality of life; uterine bleeding; cardiovascular risk; osteoporosis; premature ovarian failure; surgical menopause; mood disorders; cognitive impairment; and MHT).

#### 24 October 2021

Seven guideline topics were allocated to individual council members with a three-month completion timeline:

- o MHT Dr. M.D.P. Gooneratne
- Evaluation of Postmenopausal women Dr. Darshana Abeygunewardena
- Vasomotor symptoms Dr. Mangala Dissanayake
- Sexual health & Quality of life Dr. Madura Jayawardene
- Postmenopausal Osteoporosis Prof. Piyusha Atapattu
- o Premature ovarian failure & Surgical menopause Dr. M. Sathanandan
- Genitourinary symptoms (Vulval dystrophy) Dr.(Ms) Janakie Karunasinghe
- Mood disorders & Depression Dr.(Ms)
   Dasanthi Akmeemana

It was decided to release these short guidelines as **National Guidelines for public use**.

#### 19 December 2021

The Council agreed to upload the short menopause guidelines to the Website separately and to complete the full guidelines by 31 December 2021.

# 23 January 2022

Comprehensive guidelines were completed, and it was proposed to present it to the DGHS to be used as National Guidelines

### 12 January 2024

UNFPA funded the development of a trilingual guideline book titled "All About Menopause" for both the public and healthcare workers and supported continued local guideline development.

#### 2024

MENOSOC contributed to the revision of the National Guidelines for the Well Woman Program.

#### **April 2025**

MENOSOC held a further meeting with UNFPA to review the progress on the ongoing guideline development project.

# Research as a Priority

The constitution of the Menopause Society of Sri Lanka identified research as a key priority, explicitly stating in its objectives under item (d): "To advance the knowledge of and research on menopause." From the society's early days, research was actively encouraged. All Annual Scientific Sessions included presentations of free papers, and awards were presented for the best papers to foster and recognize academic contributions. The Founder President, along with a few other dedicated members, supported these awards for nearly two decades.

#### **Educational and Research Fund of Menopause**

In 2006, A discussion took place in the council on establishing a fund for research. In 2023, Founder President Dr. M.D.P. Gooneratne established the Educational and Research Fund of Menopause with a generous donation of Rs. 200,000.00. The purpose of this fund is to support and promote future research initiatives undertaken by the society, thereby strengthening its commitment to evidence-based advancements in menopausal health.

#### Research activities conducted

The MENOSOC commenced its research activities as early as 2005, beginning with a survey conducted among general practitioners in the Western and Central Provinces on menopause-related knowledge and practices. The findings of this study were presented on 25 September 2005 by the main coordinators-Dr. Nalinda Rodrigo for the Western Province and Prof. W.I. Amarasinghe for the Central Province.

In 2013, the Menopause Society of Sri Lanka aimed to participate in a multi-country research study on cardiovascular risk in menopause, led by Prof. Mary Ann Lumsden from Glasgow, UK. Unfortunately, the initiative could not proceed due to a lack of financial sponsorship.

In 2014, an attempt to carry out research to obtain national figures related to menopause, with the assistance of the Ministry of Health, also did not succeed due to the same reason.

A landmark research project titled "Survey of Health Issues of Postmenopausal Women of Sri Lanka: A Pilot Study in Selected Public Health Midwife (PHM) Areas" was conducted in the Kalutara District, spearheaded by Dr. Chanil Ekanayake, Chairman of Academic Activities.

The final report was submitted to the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) by the end of 2023 Preliminary findings were presented through two oral presentations at the MENOSOC 2023 Annual Academic Sessions. Additionally, a full paper based on the study was accepted for publication in the *Journal of Midlife Health*. Supported by a grant of Rs. 3.4 million from the UNFPA, this project marks the first fully funded and successfully executed research initiative by the Menopause Society of Sri Lanka.

# **Books and Chapters**



#### 1. A Handbook for healthcare workers

A Handbook specifically meant for midwives and nurses was developed and published in 2014. The Sinhala translation, titled "Arthawaharanaya,"

"ආර්තවහරණය" was printed and distributed in two phases (2017 and 2019), with a total of 10,000 copies disseminated to all midwives in Sri Lanka through the Ministry of Health and the Family Health Bureau. Additional copies were distributed to nurses who participated in menopause awareness programmes conducted island-wide by the Menopause Society. 





# Newsletter & Journal

Initial discussions on publishing a news bulletin in both English and Sinhala took place at the 8<sup>th</sup> Council Meeting of the MENOSOC on 16 September 2001. The primary objectives of the newsletter were to keep members informed about society's events and activities, provide updates on the Annual Academic Sessions, highlight upcoming events, and disseminate knowledge on developments in menopause-related health.



Following several planning meetings, the society published a leaflet newsletter on 2 May 2002, titled "Newsletter – Menopause Society of Sri Lanka." It was sponsored by New Zealand Milk Lanka (Pvt) and was distributed among the society's members.

The "Newsletter of Menopause Society of Sri Lanka" was continued to publish till end of year 2010. In year 2011, the newsletter was renamed as "MENOSOC" with a new design.


In year 2023, the Council took a decision to publish paperless E-newsletter in par with the society's policy of adhering to "Green Environment" concept.

Currently, "MENOSOC" E-newsletter is a trimestral publication of the Menopause Society of Sri Lanka, published in March, July and November months. Soft copies of the E-newsletter are emailed to the membership of the society.



General public can access the E-newsletter via www.menopause.lk website.

More than 40 issues of the newsletter under 14 volumes have been published so far.



The first issue of the Sri Lanka Journal of Menopause (SLJOM) was launched on 29 September 2019, during the Annual Academic Sessions of Menopause Society of Sri Lanka.

12 issues of the journal under 06 volumes have been published so far. Currently, Dr. Sharada Jayalath, consultant obstetrician and gynaecologist and the editor of Menopause Society of Sri Lanka is holding the post of editor-in-chief of the journal since year 2025.

#### Journal - Sri Lanka Journal of Menopause (SLJOM)

Initial discussions for the publishing of a menopause related journal happened at a council meeting held on 16 November 2003. Fulfilling that requirement, first ever medical journal related to post reproductive health in Sri Lanka named "Sri Lanka Journal of Menopause (SLJOM)" was published in year 2019.

**SLJOM** is an editorially independent publication, and this journal publishes peer reviewed work in all areas of Menopause including urogynaecology, oncology and clinical practice. This journal provides a medium to both senior, renowned clinicians as well as young enthusiasts to share their scientific publications on this evolving field of menopause. This is a biannual scientific journal with high quality scientific papers, reviews and studies.

Dr. Sanath Lanerolle, consultant obstetrician and gynaecologist and past president of Menopause Society of Sri Lanka, pioneered in publishing the journal and he was the first editor-in-chief of the journal. Dr. Sharada Jayalath, consultant obstetrician and gynaecologist and Dr. Chanil Ekanayake, consultant obstetrician and gynaecologist were the associate editors.







First editorial board of the journal included Dr. Hemantha Perera, Dr. M.D.P. Gooneratne, Dr. (Mrs.) Marlene Abeywardena, Dr. Chaminda Mathota, Dr. Rohana Haththotuwa, Dr. Harsha Atapattu, Dr. Sunil Fernando, Dr. Rukshan Fernandopulle, Prof. Malik Goonawardene, Dr. P.C. Gunasekara, Dr. M. Sathanandan, Dr. Mangala Dissanayake and Dr. Ruwan Silva.

Prof. Firdousi Begam from Bangladesh and Dr. Asoka Weerakkody from United Kingdom honoured to be the international advisory board members. Dr. Janitha Hettiarachchi was the initial statistical advisor of the journal.

The journal was registered at National Library and Documentation Services Board (NLDSB) and obatained both ISBN and ISSN (2706-0225) numbers. In years 2021, SLJOM was able to in partnership with Sri Lanka Journals Online (SLJOL) and managed to obtain DOI registration. Initially the journal was published as both a printed version and an E-version. Since year 2023, adhering to the society's policy of "Green Environment" concept, only the E-version is issued. It can be accessed via the official website of the Menopause Society of Sri Lanka, www.menopause.lk.



#### Website

It was a long-awaited need to launch a website completely dedicated to pre and postmenopausal health in Sri Lanka. Main idea of establishing the website was to share the events, activities and programmes conducted by the Menopause Society. It also helped to update the general public on menopause and menopause related health issues.

As a result of multiple discussions held with officials of Sri Lanka College of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists (SLCOG), Menopause Society of Sri Lanka was able to develop a web page on the SLCOG website (<a href="www.slcog.lk">www.slcog.lk</a>) on 27 February 2007.

However, this provided a limited platform to fulfil the main objectives of the website. Therefore, the requirement of the development of proper website owned by Menopause Society of Sri Lanka remained.

First ever website of Menopause Society of Sri Lanka was launched on 12 February 2012. The initial web address was <a href="www.menosocsl.lk">www.menosocsl.lk</a>. This gave a complete platform to share the events, activities and programmes conducted by the Menopause Society of Sri Lanka. This website was completely updated on 13 September 2015.

By year 2017, the old web site was not functioning properly and the need of a new website running on a new platform emerged. A complete redesigning of the old website was done and it was set on a new platform with a new web address of <a href="https://www.manopause.lk">www.manopause.lk</a>.

Health professionals involved in providing pre and postmenopausal healthcare are privileged to access guidelines, handbooks published by the Menopause Society through the website. In addition, upcoming events, health education materials and contact details can be accessed.

In year 2022, short videos produced by the Menopause Society were uploaded to the website for public awareness.



# Use of Social Media for Awareness and Outreach - Facebook, YouTube, and WhatsApp.

It was felt that the time is opportune to expand the use of web-based social media platforms to disseminate information about the society and increase public knowledge on menopause. Social media plays a crucial role in raising awareness by encouraging open dialogue, offering support, and advocating for change.

These platforms provide a convenient and accessible way for postmenopausal women to find information on symptom management, treatment options, and lifestyle advice. They also serve as effective channels for sharing details of the society's activities and upcoming events.

While caution must be exercised to prevent the spread of misinformation, the positive impact of social media on menopause awareness is undeniable. Currently, the Menopause Society of Sri Lanka actively uses several popular platforms, including **Facebook, YouTube**, and **WhatsApp**.

The Society maintains an official Facebook account (Menosoc Sri Lanka) and an official Facebook page (Menopause Society of Sri Lanka). The Facebook account was created on August 7, 2014, and the page was launched on April 7, 2016. Both are widely used to share updates on events, activities, and programs, promote upcoming initiatives, and educate the general public on menopause-related issues.

Official YouTube channel of MENOSOC is mainly used for public awareness. This channel was established on 30 September 2019. It contains more than 15 public awareness videos.

#### **Facebook**

It was felt that opportune time has arrived to use more web-based social media to disseminate information about the society as well as knowledge on menopause. Social media is playing a crucial role in raising awareness about menopause by fostering open conversations, providing support, and advocating for change.

It offers a convenient and easy way for postmenopausal women to access information about menopause, including symptom management, treatment options, and lifestyle advice. It also helpful in disseminating the details of activities done by the society and upcoming events.

While it's important to be mindful of misinformation, the positive impact of social media on menopause awareness is undeniable. Currently, most popular social media flatforms including Facebook, YouTube and WhatsApp are widely being used by the Menopause Society of Sri Lanka.

Menopause Society of Sri Lanka maintains an official Facebook account (Menosoc Sri Lanaka) and an official Facebook page (Menopause Society of Sri Lanka). Facebook account was established on 07 of August 2014. Facebook page was established on 07 of April 2016.

These Facebook account and the Facebook page are being widely utilized to share the details of events, activities and programmes conducted by the Menopause Society, share the upcoming events and educate the general public.

# **EMA/Estate Midwives TOT Programme**

In May 2011, Menopause society applied for a Civil Society Fund Grant from the World Bank. The theme was "Mitigating the ill effects of Post reproductive age group by empowering women in the estate sector, their community leaders and the first contact health workers on the prevention, early recognition and available management options of menopausal changes in the body."

It was selected for a grant of USD10000.00. A phased out program of "**Training the trainers**" (**TOT**) was conducted in 10 tea estates in the Nuwaraeliya district in Sri Lanka.

**A Hand Book** for education and **a Log book** for entering the health issues of women in midlife were prepared and printed.





On the 15, 16 & 17 November 2011, members of Menopause Society of Sri Lanka visited all the 10 estates suggested by Plantation Human Development Trust, to check the facilities. There onwards, several visits were made to the estates for the TOT program as well as for follow up for assessment of progress, with the last visit being on 28 September, 2013.

Overall it was a very successful TOT program and it contributed as a model to many progressive steps in the direction of a better quality of life for those impoverished women in the estates.

Details of the program are found in the final report annexed below.

# Progress Report of the Estate Project of the Menopause Society of Sri Lanka in Collaboration with the World Bank of Sri Lanka



28.09.12

#### Introduction

## **Objective**

In July 2011, Menopause Society of Sri Lanka received a grant from the World Bank for a project proposal to mitigate the ill effects of Post reproductive age group by empowering women in the estate sector, their community

leaders and the first contact health workers on the prevention, early recognition and available management options of menopausal changes in the body.

This project has been successfully launched and is being carried out in 10 estates as planned. This progress report includes the activities carried out so far.

# 1<sup>st</sup> Phase

#### Requirements Gathering & Planning

- 1. Dr.Ravi Nanayakkara, Director of Health- Plantation Human Development Trust(PHDT), Mr.Mervin Perera ,Regional Director- PHDT and Dr Nihal Weerasuriya, Director- Dickoya hospital and former Regional Director of Health Services, Nuwaraeliya were invited for a preliminary discussion. Dr.Hemantha Perera, Dr.MDP Goonarathne, Dr.Mangala Dissanayake, Dr.Harsha Atapattu, Dr.Piyusha Atapattu and Dr.Sunera Fernando from Menopause Society of Sri Lanka participated for this discussion. The program was discussed in detail.
- 2. It was decided to randomly select 05 estates from Hatton PHDT Region and 05 estates from Nuwaraeliya PHDT region.

3. Ms.M.F.I.Farah (Manager Health, PHDT) sent a list of 10 estates as follows to be included for this training program.

Refer annexure I

- 4. It was felt that in addition to the Public Health Midwife (PHM), the Estate Medical Assistants (EMA) and the Welfare Officer also to be involved in the program.
- 5. Meeting was held on 26 August 2011 at Sri Lanka College of Obstetricians & Gynaecologists (SLCOG) with the participation of the council members of the Menopause Society of Sri Lanka to prepare a series of lectures/articles for the program and the handbook. Topics for the handbook were suggested and it was decided to prepare lectures, articles and newsletters in all three languages (English, Sinhalese and Tamil).
- 6. A meeting with Dr.Ravi Nanayakkara (Director Health, PHDT) was held on 25 October 2011 at SLCOG office. It was decided to initially train the midwives and these trained midwives were given the opportunity to disseminate their knowledge to the volunteers. Another separate program was planned to conduct for Estate Medical Assistants (EMA) as

their update on Menopause would be important to interact with the midwives.

7. The editorial board gathered on the 2 November 2011 at SLCOG. The board consisted of four council members of Menopause Society of Sri Lanka (Dr.Hemantha Perera, Dr.MDP Goonarathne, Dr.Piyusha Atapattu & Dr.Sunera Fernando) and two Tamil consultants (Prof.Sivasuriyam and Dr.Saravanan). The articles collected were amended and topics were finalized. Refer annexure II

8. On the 15, 16 & 17 November 2011 members of Menopause Society of Sri Lanka visited all the 10 estates suggested by Plantation Human Development Trust to check the facilities.

# 2nd Phase Implementation of the program

9. After finalizing all the articles printing of the handbooks and newsletters was started on the 13 of February 2012.

- 10. A TOT program for PHMs and welfare officers was conducted on 16 of March 2012 as planned. It was a full day session which consisted of a series of lectures and a counseling session. At the beginning of the program participants' knowledge on Menopause was tested by giving them 15 questions. Lectures were delivered by the consultants of the Menopause Society and each was interpreted into Tamil. At the end of each lecture audience was given an opportunity to ask questions from the lecturer to clarify their doubts. At the end of the program same questions were repeated to test the improvement of knowledge of participants. All the participants were given a handbook, an attendance certificate and a bag with an umbrella. In addition participants were given refreshments, lunch and a per diem. Volunteers' handbooks were given to midwives and they were asked to build a team of volunteers and disseminate their knowledge on menopause and related issues. It was felt that the communication skills of the midwives need to be improved and preparation of a logbook would be very beneficial for them when counseling people.
- 11.On the 17 March 2012 another half day session was conducted for Estate Medical Assistants (EMA). Twenty EMAs were trained in this program.

# 3rd Phase Inspection and Follow -up

- 12. Pilot testing was done on the 28 April 2012. Five consultants visited all the ten estates again to check whether prepared logbooks cover all the requirements of the midwives. It took three complete days for this and all the 50 midwives who were trained before actively involved in this process.
- 13. Subsequently an inspection program was done on 22, 23 and 24 of May 2012 to review the progress of the TOT programs. The PHMs who were trained at the TOT program had built a team of volunteers. Each team had 15-20 members and at the time inspection was done they had gone through the books.
- 14. Logbooks were printed on 7 June 2012.
- 15. A "Skype" meeting was held on 15 June 2012 with EMAs to check whether they properly supervise PHMs.
- 16. 2<sup>nd</sup> inspection was done on 2 July 2012 and the logbooks were handed over. They were given training on using the books when counseling a patient.
- 17. A Follow- up program to be done on 26-27 February 2013 to complete the project.

# Chapter 09

**Health Ministry & MENOSOC** 



#### **Midlife Clinics**

From inception, Menopause society was keen to develop a "Preventive and Curative Health service "for the women in midlife. Immediately following the first anniversary of the society, on the 15 July 2001, a peripheral clinic was conducted in Dankotuwa, on the invitation of a charity i.e. Lanka Dharmodaya Foundation. More than 100 women attended the clinic and was very encouraging as Menopause clinics were never heard of before.

However, despite repeated attempts, it was not possible to get the idea across to the health authorities as Menopause was not considered a priority health need.

By 2004, it was possible to impress upon the health officials to agree to this proposal. On 14 March 2004, two members of the society, Dr MDP Gooneratne and Prof. Asoka Gunasekara visited an existing clinic belonging to the Colombo Municipal Council, situated at Kirulapone.

Few clinics were conducted at these premises. However, without an agreed policy in the Ministry of health, this was not sustainable. Still, the seed was planted successfully and after 25 years, the Ministry of health has planned to have **1000 Midlife clinics throughout the country**. (Please see the chapter on "Collaboration with the Health Ministry" for the present status.)

# National Task Force on Post-Reproductive Health (NTFP)

The National Task Force on Post-Reproductive Health (NTFP) of Sri Lanka emerged as a pioneering national effort to address the long-overlooked health needs of post-reproductive women. This initiative was spearheaded by the Menopause Society of Sri Lanka, in collaboration with the Ministry of Health, and supported by various professional bodies and stakeholders.

#### September 2014

The origins of the MTF can be traced back to a 2014 meeting with the UNFPA, where discussions focused on postmenopausal health and cancer.

The Council decided to approach the Director General of Health Services (DGHS), Dr. P.G. Maheepala, about establishing a multi-disciplinary **Task Force on Cancer in Postmenopausal Women**, with potential UNFPA funding. Discussions also covered **teacher education in post-reproductive health** and the use of midwives to conduct a national menopause survey.

#### 21 October 2014

At the first meeting with the DGHS, Dr. P.G. Maheepala agreed to make initial arrangements for the Task Force, including forming regular meetings with professional colleges and seeking UNFPA support. He suggested referring to the teacher-education component to the Ministry of Education's focal point at Family Health Bureau.

#### 23 February 2015

In the second meeting, the DGHS requested that the Menopause Society take the lead in formally establishing the Task Force by writing to relevant professional bodies.

- Letters were sent to colleges of General Practitioners, Psychiatrists, Physicians, and Obstetricians for nominations.
- A proposal for establishing Midlife Clinics was initiated at hospitals like Homagama, Panadura, and Horana.
- Approval was given for Training of Trainers (TOT)
  programs for teachers and nurses.
- Plans for a National Survey on Menopause and research funding were also discussed.

#### 27 April 2015

At the third meeting, the **DGHS formally approved the NTFP** and agreed to explore funding for related research.

It was agreed to conduct **Midlife clinics** along with well woman clinics. Plans were also made to pilot Midlife Clinics at Base Hospitals in Homagama, Kalutara, Panadura, and Horana.

It was agreed to distribute Handbooks already published by MENOSOC to all midwives through Supervising Nursing officers.

DGHS requested MENOSOC to develop TOR for the NTFP.

#### 19 July 2015

Draft proposal of the Task Force was presented to the DGHS.

#### 26 August 2015

At the fourth DGHS meeting, the Society justified the Task Force by outlining the projected health and economic burden of post-reproductive issues and presented **a draft proposal** to the DGHS. They agreed on a **focal agency** (Family Health Bureau or future Non-Communicable Disease Bureau) and presented the drafted **detailed TOR** and stakeholder roles.

### 22 January 2016

The inaugural meeting of the National Task Force on Post Reproductive Health (PRH) was held. Key decisions included:

- Formation of a **Steering Committee** and a **Working Committee**.
- An agreement to design a comprehensive care package encompassing NCD screening, cancer screening, menopause management, and counseling.
- Plans to use Healthy Life Clinics and Well Woman Clinics as delivery points.
- Introduction of a **personal health record** for postreproductive women.
- A pilot program was planned in **one district** within two months.

- The FHB was confirmed as the **Task Force's focal agency**.
- **TOT modules** for public health nursing and teacher education were approved.

#### 20 March 2016

- FHB took over as the **focal agency**.
- **Training programs** were launched, starting with Kalutara district.
- Educational content was developed and translated into **Sinhala, Tamil, and English**.
- The MENOSOC was to develop training **modules**, **Handbooks and flip charts**.
- Decided to incorporate post reproductive care into national health service.
- A pilot midlife clinic at Castle Street Hospital for Women (CSHW) was suggested.
- Screening protocols (at ages 35 and 45), referral pathways for menopause symptoms were discussed.

#### 10 July 2016

Launching a pilot well-woman clinic in Kalutara and planning a training program at the National Institute of Health Sciences (NIHS).

#### 27 July-5 August 2016

The "TOT" program at NIHS for health care workers was conducted in two batches, covering curriculum content for midlife care.





#### September 2016

A **Pilot Midlife Clinic model** was carried out in Kalutara Healthy Life Centres and Well-Woman Clinics, demonstrating personal health records for women.

#### 23 October 2016

Task Force members proposed creating a **permanent unit** within the Ministry of Health to oversee post-reproductive health activities.

#### **28 November 2016**

An annual grant of Rs. 200,000 was secured for the Menopause Society.

#### **12 February 2017**

A letter was sent to the FHB requesting inclusion of **post-reproductive health modules** in MOH, nursing, and midwife training curricula.

#### 12 March 2017

Following activities were finalized: staff and public education, establishment of **Healthy Life Clinics** with Pap-smear capability, Information Education & Communication (IEC) material development, and a "35+Club" for community outreach.

#### 15 March 2017

In a meeting with FHB, the Task Force defined its target age group (45–65), integrated with reproductive health steering, and set priorities: screening protocols, management algorithms, referral systems, and lifestyle intervention strategies.

#### 14 May 2017

Monthly Task Force steering-committee meetings were scheduled.

#### 16 July 2017

A new FHB circular was drafted to add **osteoporosis screening** to the well-woman clinic protocol.

#### 20 August 2017

The FHB circular was expanded to include menopause symptoms, psychological concerns, sexual function, and finalized osteoporosis screening tools, with referral guidelines for hot flushes.

#### **12 November 2017**

A circular introducing post-reproductive health into Well-Woman Clinic services was approved; flip charts and 1,000 copies of new clinic records were printed for distribution.

#### 27 January 2018

The FHB requested **Tamil translations of the midlife clinic flip chart** (English and Sinhala versions were completed).

# 25 February 2018

**Menopause-related disorder screening** was officially included in the updated Well-Woman Clinic circular.

#### 18 March 2018

The NTFP requested addition of menopause symptoms to the national personal health record.

#### 19 August 2018

MENOSOC distributed midwives' handbooks (1,000 Sinhala, 500 Tamil, 500 English) and arranged reprinting.

#### 25 October 2020

The DGHS formally authorized the establishment of **Midlife Clinics**, with the first clinic to open at Castle Street Hospital for Women in November; Health Minister Pavithra Wanniarachchi was invited as Chief Guest.

#### 17 January 2021

Suggested to establish Midlife Clinics at De Soyza Maternity, Colombo North Teaching, and Wathupitiwala Base Hospitals.

#### **14 February 2021**

A coordination proposal was submitted to streamline menopause services across Well-Woman Clinics, breast clinics, and NCD units.

### 27 June 2021

The Menopause Society completed the **Midlife Clinic** record book (funded by UNFPA) and began Tamil translation.

#### **19 December 2021**

Midlife Clinic roll-out was postponed 2–3 months due to the COVID-19 pandemic, with Homagama Hospital selected as the next pilot site.

#### **27 February 2022**

Planning resumed for Midlife Clinics at Colombo North, Castle Street, De Soyza, Ragama, Kalutara, and Homagama Hospitals.

#### 24 April 2022

**Personal health record prototype** was discussed at the council and pre-testing with staff and patients was planned.

## 30 April 2023

The Society proposed letters to the DGHS and FHB to secure a clinic-record "H-number" and finalized hospital selection criteria for Midlife Clinics.

#### **24 September 2023**

Feasibility discussions were held on **integrating Well-Woman Clinics and Midlife Clinics** into a unified service model.

#### **12 September 2024**

An educational program for staff of Castle Street Hospital for Women was carried out for Midlife Clinic operations.

### **Legacy and Impact**

The NTFP has grown from an advocacy effort to a national movement.

- Recognized menopause as a distinct and important phase of women's health.
- Embedded post-reproductive health into Sri Lanka's public health agenda.
- Enabled cross-sector collaboration across health, education, and social services.
- Created a model that could be replicated in other low- and middle-income countries.

### Chapter 10

**SAFOMS** 



### South Asian Federation of Menopause Societies (SAFOMS)

### 13 October 2002

MENOSOC council discussed the need to establish a SAARC Menopause Society. It was decided to invite existing menopause societies in the SAARC region to join for this cause.

### **16 February 2003**

A draft for a SAARC federation of menopause societies was discussed.

### 20 April 2003

The council decided to communicate with SAARC countries which did not have a menopause society in existence. It was felt that this way, those countries could be encouraged to form their own menopause society and join the new federation.

### **16 November 2003**

Letters were sent to all SAARC Countries for the Formation of SAARC Menopause Society.

However, the responses from the countries were not encouraging and the idea was dormant for years.

### **7 February 2010**

In early 2010, Dr. Behram Anklesaria from Ahmedabad,

India communicated with MENOSOC and expressed to revive the formation of a Federation.

He suggested a name – South Asian Menopause Societies (SAMS). However, MENOSOC members suggested South Asian Federation of Menopause Societies (SAFOMS).

MENOSOC prepared a draft constitution, and it was presented at an IMSCON in Chennai in 2010.










































### 1 October 2010 - Birth of SAFOMS

At a meeting held at the Cinnamon Lakeside Hotel in Sri Lanka, SAFOMS was officially established. Dr. Behram Anklesaria was unanimously elected as the President, with Dr. M.D.P. Gooneratne as President-Elect, Prof. Shala Katun as Vice President, and Dr. Rohana Haththotuwa as Secretary General.

### Inaugural SAFOMS conference -1-3 October 2010 Sri Lanka

This was held at the Cinnamon Lakeside Hotel in Sri Lanka on the theme of "Improving post reproductive life of south Asian women". Members of MENOSOC, SAFOMS, SLCOG, AOFOG and SAFOG were present.

On the **3 October 2010, the inaugural council meeting** was held at the Hotel Galadari in Sri Lanka.

### 30 November 2012 - 2<sup>nd</sup> Biennial conference of SAFOMS, Pakistan

This was held in Karachi, Pakistan. Thirteen members of MENOSOC participated.

Dr M.D.P. Gooneratne from Sri Lanka was inducted as the 2<sup>nd</sup> President of SAFOMS.

### Behram Anklesaria memorial Oration - 30 November 2012

Dr M.D.P. Gooneratne delivered this oration on "SAFOMS challenges & Opportunities".

### 1 November 2014

Nepal was admitted as a member society of SAFOMS.

### February 2015 -

### 3<sup>rd</sup> Biennial conference of SAFOMS.

This had to be postponed as the host country, Bangladesh was having a civil unrest.

### 8-9 May 2015 -

3<sup>rd</sup> Biennial conference of SAFOMS, Bangladesh.

This was held in Dhaka, Bangladesh.

Prof Rubina Hussain from Pakistan was inducted as the 3<sup>rd</sup> President of SAFOMS.





**17-19 February 2017 - 4**<sup>th</sup> **Biennial conference of SAFOMS - Raipur, India**Prof Shahla Khatun from Bangladesh was inducted as the 4<sup>th</sup> President of SAFOMS.

**20-21 2019 - 5<sup>th</sup> Biennial conference of SAFOMS - Dhaka, Bangladesh** Prof Jaideep Malhotra from India was inducted as the 5<sup>th</sup> President of SAFOMS.

Dr. Syeda Batool from Pakistan was inducted as the 6<sup>th</sup> President of SAFOMS.





### 15 December 2023 - Registration as a Company

Following considerable effort, particularly by Dr. M.D.P. Gooneratne, SAFOMS was officially registered as a company in Sri Lanka in 2024. This registration was a crucial step, especially to facilitate international banking and monetary transactions among member countries. As a result, the head office of SAFOMS is now based in Sri Lanka.

Dedicated to uphold the objectives of the SAFOMS.

### 1. Objectives

The objectives of SAFOMS shall be-

- 1.1 To bring together the members of the menopause societies within the region for closer cooperation and social understanding.
- 1.2 To achieve and maintain a better quality of life for women in the region in post reproductive life.
- 1.3 To promote the study of all aspects of the menopause and the application of that knowledge and exchange of such knowledge among the members of menopause societies in the region.
- 1.4 To create awareness and educate the general public of the effects and complications of menopause and the management thereof.
- 1.5 To encourage and maintain research on post reproductive health in the region
- 1.6 To liaise with other international and regional organizations concerned with post reproductive health
